



### What is the Unit?

A base where a few students are taught without having any contact with the main school. The aim is to modify behaviour, provide support and provide respite for other students and staff.

### Who is placed in the Unit?

Students who have failed to comply with our Behaviour Policy i.e. they have been on Stage 2, or a Student Support Contract, and a Case Conference has been held.

### What happens at the Case Conference?

Senior staff, behaviour staff and the student's tutor meet with parents and the student. Targets and the daily routine are discussed together with the date of the next case conference.

### For how long do the students work in the Unit?

The standard timescale is half a term but students who achieve and behave well can start to be re-integrated after three weeks.

### What happens in the Unit?

Students don't arrive until 10:00 am and so they work until 4-15pm, 3:45pm on Fridays. Students bring their own lunch or have a free meal delivered to the Unit. They have English and Mathematics lessons, some support from outside agencies as appropriate, and some Science and project work.

### How do parents hear about progress?

Students take work home to show parents and there is also homework. Parents sign to say that they have seen the work.

### How are students re-integrated into mainstream?

When re-integration begins parents are telephoned on a weekly basis. Teaching groups and staff are chosen carefully and students carry a report sheet with targets.
